Subordinating Conjunctions and Complex Sentences- (ELAGSE3L1.h.i) Simple sentences can be combined using different kinds of conjunctions. One wway to combine simple sentences is to use a conjunction such as AFTER, BECAUSE, WHEN, or WHILE. When you combine two simple sentences with such conjunctions, you form a complex sentence.

Example:

**Lauren did not stay for the game. She loves softball. ---<u>two simple sentences</u>

**Lauren did not stay for the game although she loves softball. ---<u>one complex sentence</u>

Capitalization in Titles (ELAGSE3L2.a.)

using the conjunction although.

There is a special way to write the title of a book, magazine newspaper, or movie. Always capitalize the first words, the last word and all the IMPORTANT words in the title. DO NOT capitalize short words such as: a, an, the, and, of, for, in, and on unless they are the first or last word of the title.
