Simple sentences can be combined using different kinds of conjunctions. One way to combine simple sentences is to use a conjunction such as AFTER, BECAUSE, WHEN, or WHILE. When you combine two simple sentences with such conjunctions, you form a complex sentence.

Example:

**Lauren did not stay for the game. She loves softball. ---two simple sentences

**Lauren did not stay for the game although she loves softball. ---one complex sentence using the conjunction although.

Capitalization in Titles (ELAGSE3L2.a.)

There is a special way to write the title of a book, magazine newspaper, or movie.

Always capitalize the first words, the last word and all the IMPORTANT words in the title. DO NOT capitalize short words such as: **a, an, the, and, of, for, in, and on** unless they are the first or last word of the title.
