Grammar:

Possessive Nouns (ELAGSE3L2.d)

Possessive nouns show ownership. Add an apostrophe *s* to a noun that doesn't end in *s* to show ownership. For example- the girl's dog. Add an apostrophe to a noun that ends in *s* to show ownership. For example- the lions' den.

Possessive Pronoun (ELAGSE3L2.d)

When a pronoun shows ownership, it is called a possessive pronoun. A possessive pronoun can be singular or plural. It must agree with, or match, the noun it is replacing.

Singular: my, your, his, her, its

Plural: your, their, our

Adding Suffixes (ELAGSE3L2.e)

A suffix is a word part added to the end of a base word. Adding a suffix changes the meaning of a word.

Example: walk + er = walker happy + ness = happiness sad + ly = sadly
