## Grammar:

Prefix and Suffix (ELAGSE3L4b)

A prefix is a word part added to the beginning of a word. A suffix is a word part added to the end of a word. Both prefixes and suffixes can change the meaning of the root or base word.

Root Words (ELAGSE3L4c)

The root or base word can help you figure out the meaning of related words.

Example: The words unhappy and happiness are related words. The root word is happy. The meaning of happy can be changed by using a prefix or suffix.
