Many words have more than one meaning, or definition. You can use a dictionary or a glossary to check the exact meaning of a word or a phrase. To find the right meaning of the word, first read all the definitions. Then see which meaning makes sense in the sentence you are reading.

Literal and Nonliteral meanings (ELAGSE3L5.a)

Words and phrases often have more than one meaning. Sometimes words and phrases mean exactly what they say, however sometimes words and phrases have a meaning that is different from their usual meaning.

Real-life Connections (ELAGSE3L5.b)

When reading, you can connect words on the page to your own life or to the wider world. Connecting words with real-life events can make their meaning clearer.
